

Conference proposals do not automatically receive an endorsement as being Trauma Informed. If you would like your presentation to be considered for this endorsement by the Trauma Informed Endorsement Committee, please indicate that in your proposal and be sure that the following information is identified clearly in your proposal.

1. The Presenter should meet the following criteria: Licensed Mental Health Therapist, or other professional with demonstrable expertise in relevant area based on education and/or experience
2. Identify within the proposal how the presentation is applicable to the experience of trauma for adult or children survivors of domestic violence.
3. If your presentation is relevant to clinical practice, within the proposal address material according to evidence-based principles as described in [SAMSHA Treatment Improvement protocol #57: "Trauma-Informed Care in Behavioral Health Services"](#) Within your proposal identify which specific principles are being addressed
4. If your presentation is not relevant to clinical practice, within the proposal address material according to ["SAMHSA's Concept of Trauma and Guidance for Trauma-Informed Approach"](#) This includes the six key principles of trauma -informed approach: Safety; Trustworthiness and Transparency; Peer Support; Collaboration and Mutuality; Empowerment, Voice, and Choice and Cultural, Historical and Gender Issues. Identify within your proposal which principles of trauma informed approach are addressed

To be considered for an endorsement, this information must be clearly stated and readily identified by those reviewing the proposal.
